



Parents Code of Behaviour

- Remember that children participate in sport for their enjoyment, not yours.
- Encourage children to participate, do not force them.
- Focus on the child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing.
- Encourage children always to play according to the rules and to settle disagreements without resorting to hostility or violence.
- Never ridicule or yell at a child for making a mistake or losing a competition.
- Remember children learn best by example. Appreciate good performances and skilful plays by all participants
- Support all efforts to remove verbal and physical abuse from sporting activities.
- Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise.
- Show appreciation for volunteer coaches, officials and administrators. Without them, your child could not participate.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural back ground or religion.

Spectators Code of Behaviour

- Remember that people participate in sport for their enjoyment and benefit, not yours.
- Applaud good performance and efforts from <u>all</u> individuals and teams. Congratulate <u>all</u> participants on their performance regardless of the games outcome.
- Respect the decisions of the officials and teach young people to do the same.
- <u>Never</u> ridicule a young player for making a mistake. Positive comments are motivational.
- Condemn the use of violence in any form, whether it is by spectators, coaches, officials or players.
- Show respect for your team opponents. Without them, there will be no game.
- Encourage players to follow the rules and the officials' decisions.
- <u>Do not</u> use foul language, sledge or harass players, coaches or officials.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural back ground or religion.
