

ALEX WEBB AWARD

SELECTION CRITERIA

Alex Webb was an outstanding 12-year-old soccer player, playing at Sherbrooke Rangers Junior Soccer Club, who died in a tragic BMX accident at Monbulk in July 2008.

Alex had just been chosen to represent Victoria's U14 VCSA State team as their goalkeeper for the upcoming Queensland National titles. At the age of 12 this reflected the outstanding talent he exhibited on the soccer field.

The award is presented to a junior player in the U11 - U13 age bracket.

The player must exhibit outstanding qualities and commitment to soccer. He/she is always willing to help his/her fellow players, showing commitment to the team and the club by leading through example.

The Coaching Staff or Committee Member would be looking for a player who exhibits outstanding soccer qualities and a commitment to soccer through participation, effort and endeavour.

All nominees must be financial playing members of the club.

The coaching staff or committee member should present a recommendation in writing to the committee detailing the reasons for the recommendation. The committee will request recommendations by a set closing date after which they will ratify recommendations suitable for nomination. Selection of the winner will be made by an independent panel of Executive members from the approved nominations.

Each nominee will receive a certificate to be presented on Presentation Day. The winner will be announced and presented with a trophy and their name inscribed on the perpetual Alex Webb Award, which is retained by the club.
